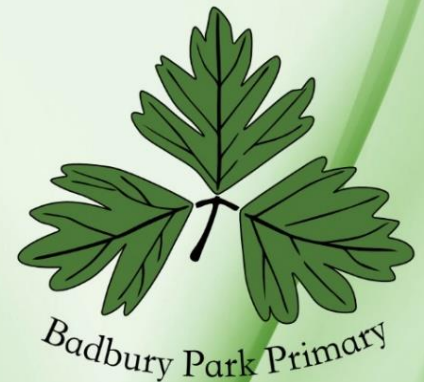


Our Vision

School uniform:

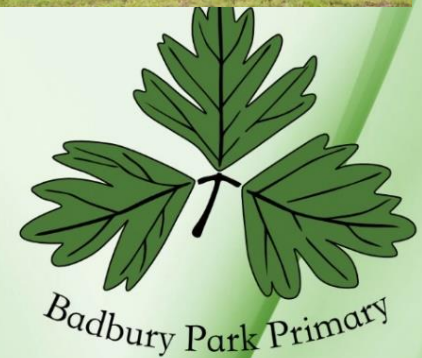
- Grey school jumper/cardigan

Lunch Club








- Children who stay all day (from 08.30-3.15 - 3.45 hours) will have a lunch hour from 11.30-12.30 which will be chargeable at £4 per hour.

Lunchtime Meal

- If you would like to book a hot lunch, there is an additional charge of £2.30.
- If you do not want to book a hot lunch, children are able to bring a healthy packed lunch from home.

Bring a snack when you pick them up.



Whole Grains <small>(Great for Snack or Lunch)</small> Make sandwiches with whole grain bread. Look for labels that say "100% Whole Grain"	 
Snacks Pack healthy snacks each day. Add a healthy sweet or savory treat. Try whole grain crackers and pretzels for savory snacks or dried fruits for sweet treats.	 
Fruit <small>(Great for Snack or Lunch)</small> Pack fresh fruit each day for snack and lunch. These are easy, convenient ways to add fruits to your day	   
Veggies <small>(Great for Snack or Lunch)</small> Add veggies in your child's lunch. They add a healthy crunch instead of chips.	  



Transition

Stay and Play: a chance to meet teachers and other parents. You can explore inside and outside, playing with your child and talking about all the things they can do when they start.

The next date for this is:

Tuesday 25th June from 3.30 to 4.15pm

You should have received your induction information with date and time for home visit.



Wednesday 4th September

You have been sent a one-hour slot for your child to attend. During this session, you will leave your child with us to see how they settle.

If the session goes well and your child is happy, they will then begin their regular sessions from **Thursday 5th September**.

If your child needs a little longer to settle, we will work with you to plan a longer transition into Nursery.

Starting Times and Parking



Nursery will start at 8:30 – please be on time!
(Arrive at 8:25)
If you are late, the gate will be closed and you will need to go through the office.

Rainscombe Road will be closed to all vehicles (apart from residents and blue badge holders) from 8:15am-9:00am and 2:30pm-3:15pm.

Parking is not available at the front of school during drop off and pick up times unless you are a blue badge holder.

If you need to drive to school, we ask that you park a short distance away and walk the rest of your journey.

Outdoor Learning and Welly Walks

We will start welly walks as soon as the children are settled into nursery.

All children have access to outdoor space as soon as we go to explore and learn. The children are able to set their own learning and follow their interests. Being able to freeflow allows for deeper level of learning and engagement.

Children will need

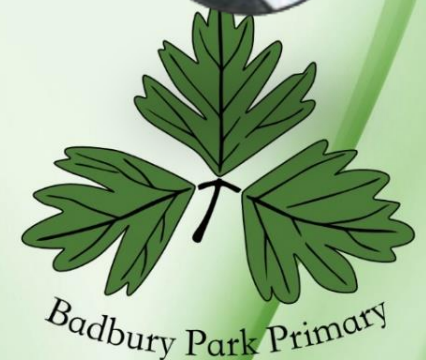
- warm and waterproof clothing
- old trainers or wellington boots
- Hats in cold weather
- Change of clothes in school

Children will learn

- risk taking and boundary setting
- scientific and environmental knowledge
- respect for the environment
- communication skills

Children will build

- confidence and self esteem and a sense of awe and wonder



How can you help at home?

- Encourage indoor voices and walking inside
- Encourage children to tidy away their toys
- Independently put on coats
- Encourage your child to be curious and enjoy the outdoors
- Read together at home – magazines, picture books, school books
- Ditch the buggy and dummy.
- Encourage sharing and responding to boundaries.
- World Health Organisation – 3 hours of physical activity per day
- 10-13 hours of good quality sleep.

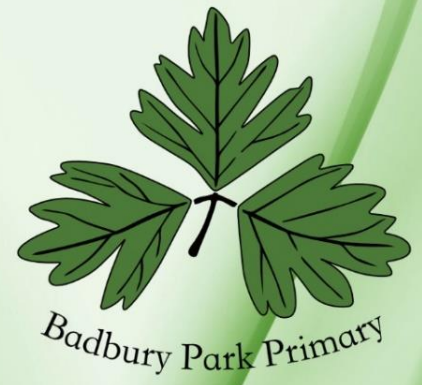

Reading at home is one of the best ways to support your child's learning.

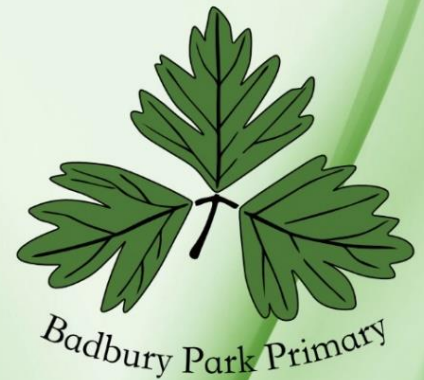
If you read just **one** book a day to your child, they will have been read **1825** books by their 5th birthday.

Top Tips:

- No distractions – turn off the TV, put down the tablet
- We will send home a picture book each week for you to share and enjoy with your child.
- These will be changed on a Thursday.
- We will share some ideas and prompts of how to enjoy a story together
- When you are out and about, encourage your child to read shopping lists, familiar logos



“How was your day?” “Fine!”

Ideas of questions to ask your children...

- What did your friend tell you that you did not know before?
- Who did you sit next to at lunch?
- Who was the first person you smiled at?
- Who made you laugh?
- What was your favourite moment from today?
- What did you find easy and what did you find hard?

Also be ready to share some of your day too.

First aid:

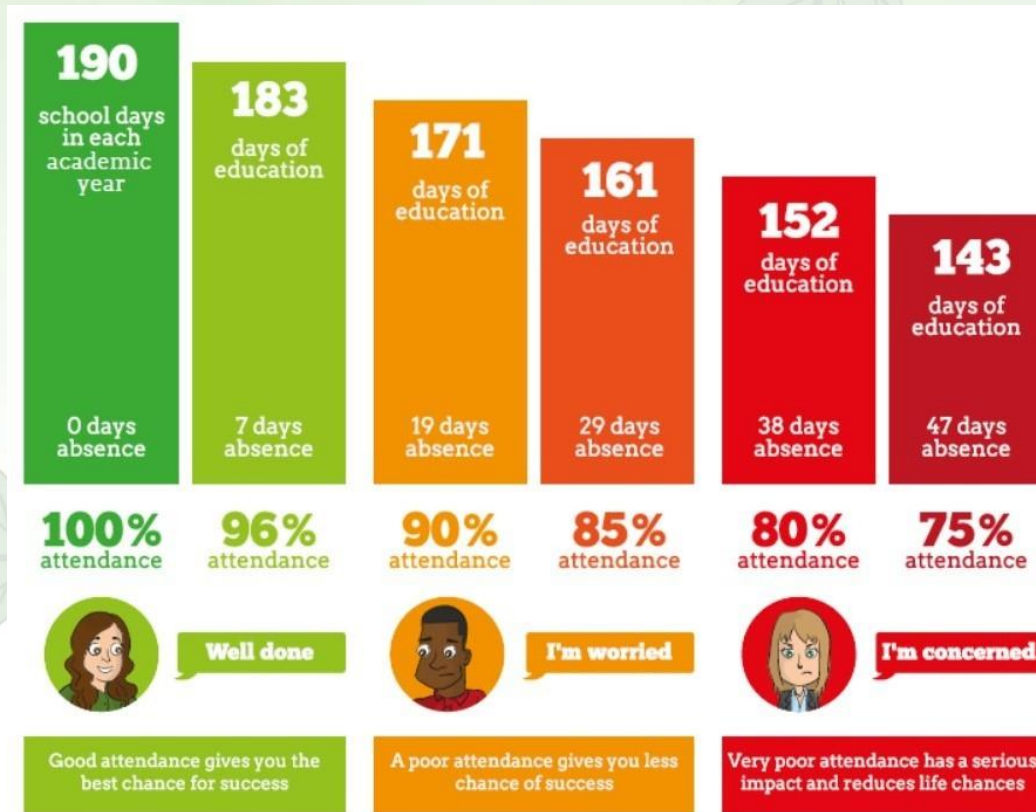
