and being able to play together. We also had a visit from Swindon Town who showed us how to pass and dribble the ball to each other. Jungle Jonathan was a huge hit and we were impressed with how adventurous and curious the children were in touching or

holding the animals. We reminded them that it is OK to be nervous, that can make us the best kind of brave! Finally, we joined Miss

Lawrence for dance and they all listened and responded to the music in lots of different ways. Well done Apple Tree for your fantastic enthusiasm for all our activities.





Reception: Another busy week full of excitement and exploring! Ash and Oak Tree went on an adventure to Coate Water. We walked from school, had a snack and then went to explore the Garden

of Reflection. We used our sense of smell, hearing and touch to collect flowers and used these to make our class names. We then got to ride on the miniature railway, looking out for gnomes, owls, squirrels and screaming when we went through the tunnels. In maths we have been learning about time and money this week, using loose parts to make clocks and lining up to 'pay' for snack.

We all loved taking part in sports day, cheering on our friends, trying our best and most importantly having fun!

Jungle Jonathan came to visit us and we got to hold a millipede and a snake – we were very brave!









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KS1 Year 1 children entered the last two weeks of the school year and have been busy learning about Time. We have been practising the days of the week and the months of the year in chronological order. In true Badbury fashion we took our learning outside and had the best time learning while competing in teams! The last week has been the most memorable of the school year with lots of exciting things happening which the children have been involved in. Jungle Jonathan Roadshow, Skippy John and dancing class with Miss Lawrence were the highlight of the last week. We are very proud of the children's efforts during the sports week and their fantastic enthusiasm during Sports Day!









Year 2 had a very exciting visit from Jungle Jonathan this week where we met a range of creatures and learnt some facts about them. For our topic of volcanoes, we have been creating some art inspired by Margaret Godfrey. We explored different shades of colour through mixing primary colours to make secondary colours, we watched a video on how to draw a volcano and we gave each other feedback for how to improve our work. We can't wait for you to see our paintings at our open house next week!

In year 3 we have been writing a recount from our Jungle Jonathan visit; the creatures were amazing to see and we all had to be extremely brave. Most of us held a giant snake! In art we have been focusing on the artist Margaret Godfrey and



have created our own volcano paintings which have been inspired by her beautiful artwork. We had a great time during sports week and completed lots of different sporting activities; we all felt extremely proud of our achievements and great sportsmanship throughout the week. In classes, we have been busy practising our lines for our performance; we are looking forward to sharing this with you all next week.

Learn about parental controls as a family Parental controls can be a way to help protect your child from inappropriate online content. They are specifically designed to safeguard children from age-inappropriate material, such as pornography or adult content. They can be used to restrict the content seen, set usage times, monitor activity, prevent in-app purchases and much more.

Manage screen time: More time at home can mean more time online and this could mean that days are



taken up even more by screens. It's good to talk about screentime before the holidays, so everyone in the household is aware of what is an acceptable amount of time and no surprises are met further down the line. A lot of devices and apps now include screentime limits which can be an option to set up if you are concerned about agreements not being met. Online safety guidance: Online spaces, games and media form a large part of young people's lives. It offers a platform to connect with others and learn about new things. If parents understand the situations they encounter, they will be better placed to offer advice on how to deal with them. Click here for a printable, pocket size leaflet that gives parents and carers points to consider when it comes to understanding and dealing with online situations.

And finally....Lead by example! Children generally react well to clear and consistent boundaries – but if you limit their screen time while not monitoring your own, it can send mixed messages; it is important that you model good behaviour and follow these yourself! Some simple and fair rules, such as no devices at dinner time or before bedtime, can set a better example to follow

Thanks for everyone's support this year. Please check out this poster to see how you can get involved and support the PTA going forward



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
